



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

ARRIVAL



Welcome to the National Training Center and Fort Irwin, and congratulations on your selection for this challenging assignment! Since 1940 the high desert of the Mojave has provided the backdrop for tough, realistic training that is critical to the success of America's Army and the security of the Nation. Our location in Southern California facilitates the best training capability in the world, and provides Soldiers and Families numerous opportunities to take advantage of during their off time.

Fort Irwin has a world-class community and is an assignment of choice. During your tour at Fort Irwin you can focus on your personal, professional, and family life while contributing to the development and professionalism of the Army. On post, Fort Irwin has something for everyone: excellent schools, modern privatized housing, restaurants and shopping. Fort Irwin has new barracks, modernized Child Development Centers, a Samuel Adams Grill, multiple community parks and pavilions, and a new community garden.

Fort Irwin is located approximately 37 miles northeast of Barstow, Calif., midway between

Las Vegas and Los Angeles. The nearest airports are located in Ontario, Calif. (120 miles), Los Angeles (175 miles) and Las Vegas (180 miles). Because of the distance to the airports, it is highly recommended that Soldiers arrive to Fort Irwin with a privately owned vehicle. Another option for transportation from the airport to the post is a Greyhound Bus that will bring you to Barstow and then you can contact the AG Replacement at (760) 380-4747/3006 for transportation from Barstow to Fort Irwin. All Soldiers must report to the NTC Replacement Detachment at the Reception Campus at Building 109 to begin in-processing. The Replacement Detachment is open 24 hours daily. While in-processing lodging is provided for unaccompanied SGT's and below at the Replacement Detachment. Temporary lodging on post is available at the Landmark Inn (760) 386-4040, or there are several hotel options in Barstow.

The Villages (Pinnacle Housing office) accepts advanced applications for housing prior to arrival at Fort Irwin. For applications and information on assignments, wait lists procedures, floor plans, and policies contact The Villages at (888) 828-4144 or visit their website at: irwin.pinnaclefamilyhousing.com.

Because of our remote and isolated location, we view sponsorship of you and your family as an important part of your successful relocation to Fort Irwin. It is highly recommended that every Soldier request a sponsor and make contact with that sponsor prior to arriving at Fort Irwin. and ensure you provide your rank and full name, last four of SSN, BR/MOS, e-mail address and projected report date. The NTC G1 Strength Management Section will promptly respond and forward the request to the gaining Unit S1 for sponsorship assignment.

The sponsorship program is designed to assist Soldiers, Families and civilian employees to successfully relocate into and out of their commands. At Fort Irwin, we understand that relocation can be mentally and emotionally demanding, expensive and time consuming. We are here to assist you and to ensure your move to Fort Irwin is simple.

If you have any questions regarding your transition to the National Training Center and Fort Irwin, please contact the Replacement Detachment at (760) 380-9095/4747/3006; DSN (312) 470-9095/4747/3006.

The Landmark Inn at (760) 386-4040, is the only hotel on post. Hotel and motel lodging is also available in the Barstow area. The Barstow Chamber of Commerce website, www.barstowchamber.com, provides additional information. The Replacement Detachment provides temporary lodging for unaccompanied Soldiers E1-E6 (only) during the in-processing cycle (2-5 days).

Fort Irwin has an on-post kennel called Sgt. Fuzzbuddy's, which can provide pet boarding while waiting for housing arrangements. For more information on pricing and other requirements please call (760) 380-7387.

Fort Irwin does not have a mobile park, but it does have an RV site. Contact Outdoor Recreation for more information at (760) 380-3434.

Medical services are offered at Mary E. Walker Clinic and the Weed Army Community Hospital, which offers modern facilities with outstanding care. For more information call toll free (866) 460-5305.

Soldiers with Exceptional Family Members should contact the Fort Irwin EFMP Program Manager at (760) 380-3698, DSN (312) 470-3698 before arriving to Fort Irwin. Families not enrolled in EFMP but who have special medical or educational needs should contact their local Army Community Service EFMP manager.

There are two child development centers located on Fort Irwin. For more information call Happy Hearts at (760) 380-1253 or Cactus Corner at (760) 380-9441.

The Relocation Readiness Program provides information, guidance and assistance to help minimize the impact on Families during PCS

and ETS moves, or Soldier unaccompanied tours. The Relocation Readiness Program office is located at the Reception Campus, Building 109, and can be reached by calling (760) 380-3598. The following are some of the services provided by the program:

Relocation Welcome Packets

We provide moving packages that include information about Army Community Service and resources available on Fort Irwin. Off-post information provided includes: phone numbers, maps, school listings, church listings and "things-to-do," to name a few.

Lending Closet

We offer temporary household goods to single Soldiers and to Families who are arriving to or departing from Fort Irwin. A Department of Defense ID card is required. The following are some of the items that are available: pots, pans, dishes, glasses, infant and toddler car seats, portable baby play pens and strollers, irons and ironing boards, crock pots and electric skillets, coffee makers and alarm clocks, folding tables and chairs, and much more.

All animals that are kept as pets on post must be registered with the post veterinary services. For dogs and cats there is a mandatory micro-chipping policy. The chip carries a number which acts as an electronic I.D. tag which can be traced back to the owner. Either Avid brand or Home Again brand chips are acceptable. This policy is the result of the immense stray animal problem on post.

If your pet already has a microchip, please bring the following information to the Veterinary Clinic during normal business hours to register your pet: microchip number, vaccine history and patient records, and your military ID card.



If you do not have a microchip, please set up an appointment and bring the above information.

All active-duty military personnel and DA civilian employees who ride motorcycles on the installation must bring a Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) Basic or Experienced Rider Course SM card and have the "M" endorsement on your driver's license. Privately owned firearms stored on the installation (whether in on-post quarters or in arms rooms) must be registered. Registration must be completed within three days of reporting to Fort Irwin or within three days of acquiring the weapon. Registration of the weapon does not replace or relieve individuals of their responsibility to comply with applicable federal, state, and local laws regarding possession, purchase, sale, transfer, and transport of weapons. Weapons registration can be completed at the Visitor Center or the Police Station in Building 326. Phone: (760) 380-2707.



HOUSING



The Villages at Fort Irwin offers one, two, three, and four bedroom homes to Families and senior unaccompanied personnel stationed at Fort Irwin. Owned and operated by California Military Communities LLC, a joint venture between Clark, Pinnacle, and the U.S. Army. The Villages at Fort Irwin completed an eight-year project in March 2012. Over 700 new homes designed specifically for Army family life, renovated homes featuring EnergyStar appliances and upgraded kitchens, and new amenities including a 25,000-square-foot Community Center with resort-style pool and

Splash Park, make this self-contained community an exceptional place to call home.

The Villages at Fort Irwin accepts advanced applications for housing prior to arrival. The documents required to be placed on the waitlist include a completed housing application, a signed pet policy agreement, a current LES, a PCS Leave Form, and a DD1172 (DEERS Form). The documents can then be faxed to The Villages at (760) 386-3700. For general relocation information to include military housing, off-post housing, schools, or for assistance with specific questions or concerns contact the Fort Irwin Housing Services Office (Building 109 in the Reception Campus) at (760) 380-3576. The office has numerous listings for housing in the local community areas.

Single Soldiers E6 and above may reside in the Town Center Terrace (TCT) suites on post,

or find off-post housing with help from the RCI Housing Services Office. Rent for a TCT suite is equal to a Soldier's without dependant BAH rate. TCT's include a stove, refrigerator, dishwasher, microwave, and stackable washer/dryer.


The application documents required to be placed on the TCT waitlist are the same as the family housing documents listed above with the exception of a DD1172 (DEERS Form).

Geographical Bachelor's E6 and above may apply to be placed on the TCT waitlist, however priority is given to bonafide bachelors. The rent is still based on the Soldier's BAH without dependant rate.

Single Soldiers E5 and below are housed in unit barracks. The Single Soldier Housing office (SSHO) is located in Building 312 on the corner of First and F Streets next to Starbucks, and can be reached by calling (760) 380-7789.

The Relocation Readiness Program helps you settle into your new duty station as quickly and easily as possible. The program is located in Building 109 at the Reception Campus and can be reached at (760) 380-3598. The following services are provided:

FORT IRWIN



FORT IRWIN N.O.W.

The Fort Irwin N.O.W. (Newcomers Orientation Welcome) rolls out the red carpet on a monthly basis for our newcomers with a warm welcome full of information and fun activities. At the time of registration, participants will receive a Newcomer's ticket to "SPEED" (Soldiers & Family Program for Enlightenment, Entertainment & Discovery) and a Welcome packet. Packets include information about ACS and resources available on Fort Irwin. Off-post information provided includes: phone numbers, maps, school listings, church listings and "things-to-do," to name a few. You will also have the opportunity to talk to DENTAC, MEDDAC, CHP, ACS, CYSS, EFMP, Safety and other agencies' representatives. A bus tour of the installation is available after the briefing from 12:30 to 2:30 p.m.

SPOUSES TOUR

The Relocation Readiness Program conducts a semi-annual tour of the nearby communities. The tour stops at Calico Ghost Town, the California State Veterans Home in Barstow and the Tanger Outlets in Lenwood for some shopping. Tour includes a complimentary lunch.

IMMIGRATION

Do you need general immigration and naturalization information? Stop by and we can assist you with immigration issues, to include visas, green cards, INS forms and citizenship.

SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

All sponsors, in accordance with AR 600-8-8, are required to complete the installation's Sponsorship Training program prior to assignment of a Soldier or civilian employee.

Once an individual has been selected to serve as a sponsor he/she must take the Sponsorship course through ACS. Military and civilian personnel courses are held quarterly.

HEART'S APART

This focus group is for those Family members whose spouse is deployed or on an unaccompanied tour. The support group serves as a chain of concern for those Families.

INTERNATIONAL SPOUSES GROUP

The International Spouses Group is a multi-cultural, multi-ethnic group that brings together foreign-born spouses in an informal gathering. The group is a wonderful resource for Spouses to share information about: adjusting to life in America and the military, learning English as a second language, raising bilingual children, citizenship issues, hobbies, sharing recipes and much more.

Exceptional Family Member Program

The Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) is a mandatory enrollment program that works with other military and civilian agencies to provide comprehensive and coordinated medical, educational, housing, community support and personal services to Families with special needs. A special-needs Family member or exceptional Family member is any Family member (child or adult) with a life-threatening or chronic condition that requires specialized medical or educational services. The following service members must enroll in the program if they are identified to have exceptional Family members: Active Army, U.S. Army Reserve (USAR) Soldiers on active duty exceeding 30 days, Active Guard Reserve (AGR) and Army National Guard (ANR) personnel serving under authority of Title 10, United States Code. Soldiers are responsible for keeping their EFMP enrollment current as Exceptional Family Member conditions change, or every three years, whichever comes first.

Department of the Army civilian employees do not have to enroll in the program. However, they must identify children with special education and medical needs each time they process for assignment OCONUS, where dependent travel is authorized at government expense.

Women, Infants & Children Program

The Women, Infants & Children (WIC) program at Fort Irwin is an educational and nutritious food check program for pregnant/nursing/postpartum women, infants, and children under the age of five. Eligibility is based on family size, income, and nutritional risk. The WIC program is located at Building 1034 on Third and G Street on post, and in Barstow at 301 East Mt. View Avenue. Call (800) 472-2321 or (909) 387-8301 for an appointment.

Employment Readiness Program

The Employment Readiness Program offers job search assistance through classes, trainings and one-on-one assistance. General information is available on a walk-in basis. Personalized counseling and resume assistance is available by appointment. A weekly list of job openings on post and in the local area are sent out via e-mail to subscribers. For more information call (760) 380-5165. The program manager is located in Building 109.

Army Substance Abuse Program

The Army Substance Abuse Program (ASAP) is a comprehensive program specifically designed to strengthen the overall fitness and effectiveness of the Fort Irwin community, and to enhance the combat readiness of its personnel and units. ASAP offers a variety of services that includes:

- Alcohol and drug prevention and education for Soldiers and DA Civilians.
- The Risk Reduction Program that identifies 15 high-risk behaviors that could be problematic for Soldiers.





- The Employee Assistance Program that is designed to assist DA Civilians adversely affected by medical, behavioral and or emotional problems.
- A Suicide Prevention Program that provides resources for suicide intervention skills to reduce the occurrence of suicidal behavior across the installation.
- The Drug Testing Program which is an intervention program that alerts Soldiers' chain of command before an accident or injury occurs. It also tests DA Civilians in support of the Army's Drug Free Workplace Program.

ASAP Clinical Services offer initial assessments, medical evaluations, individual and group therapy, and referrals to inpatient and outpatient treatment. These services are offered to active-duty military personnel and their Family members who may be experiencing alcohol/drug abuse or dependency. For information on prevention and education, call (760) 380-4153. For Clinical Services, call (760) 380-4074. ASAP is located on the corner of Third Street and South Loop Road in Building 573.

Financial Readiness

Army Emergency Relief (AER) provides interest-free loans or grants during times of emergency. Examples are loans for eviction, vehicle repossession, emergency travel, funeral expenses, repair of Soldier's only essential vehicle, etc. Soldiers or Family members must visit with their Command Financial NCO prior to coming to ACS, except when a Red Cross message has been issued. The program is located in Building 561. Telephone: (760) 380-3513. After hours call (877) 272-7337 (American Red Cross, toll free).

Consumer Affairs and Finance Assistance Program

The Consumer Affairs and Finance Assistance Program (CAFAP) offers individual or group budget counseling, check writing classes, and financial management training. Financial Management Readiness Training (FMRT) offers a wide range of services to assist Soldiers and their Families to live within their means and invest for the future. Emphasis is placed upon money management, proper use of credit, financial planning for deployment, transition and relocation, insurance, and check writing principles. The goal is to enlighten Soldiers and their Families on procedures in resolving consumer complaint problems and issues. Debt Management Plan (DMP) assistance is also offered. The Financial Readiness Program Manager (FRPM) office can be reached at (760) 380-9194. The office is located in Building 111.

Family Advocacy Program

Programs and services provided by Family Advocacy are: New Parent Support Program, parenting classes, victim advocacy, stress management, anger management, couples communication, command and unit training, and deployment (pre- and post-) education for Soldiers and Families. Call (760) 380-4470 to find out how we can assist. The Family Advocacy Program Manager is located in Building 561.

Army Sexual Assault Prevention & Response Program

The Army Sexual Assault Prevention & Response Program (SAPRP) reinforces the Army's commitment to eliminate incidents of sexual assault through a comprehensive policy that focuses on: education, prevention, thorough

investigation, appropriate action, and follow-up. Army policy promotes sensitive care for victims of sexual assault and accountability for those who commit these crimes. The Victim Advocate Coordinator can be reached at (760) 380-5467 and the 24-Hour Sexual Assault Hotline number is (760) 267-6792. This office is located at Building 561 with the Family Advocacy Program.

New Parent Support Program

The New Parent Support Program (NPSP) is a professional team of social workers and nurses who provide supportive and caring services to military Families with young children. Our trained, supervised home visitors have extensive knowledge of the issues confronting today's parents. These home visitors are sensitive to the unique challenges facing military Families. Through a variety of programs including home visits, infant care classes, play morning activities, and parenting classes, the New Parent Support Program will help you learn to cope with stress, isolation, post-deployment reunions and the everyday demands of parenthood. This voluntary participation program was developed to assist military Families in many ways that friends and family do when you're back home.

Who is eligible? Military Families expecting a child or with children from birth to three years of age are eligible to participate, free of charge, in all of the services offered.

What can the NPSP do for me? This program offers expectant parents and parents of newborn and young children the opportunity to learn new skills as parents and to improve old ones. There are often many questions about the needs of infants and young children.

Play Morning is an interactive play group designed to teach parents developmentally

appropriate play and to help children improve their social, cognitive, and motor skills. For more information call (760) 380-4021/4784. The NPSP office is located at Building 561.

Life Skills Education

Fort Irwin Family Advocacy offers seminars and workshops, which are available to individuals and couples, units, and unit Family Readiness Groups (FRGs). The coordinator for this program is located in Building 561 and can be reached at (760) 380-4474.

Victim Advocacy Program

Victim Advocates are on call 24 hours per day, seven days per week to assist victims of domestic violence. Victim Advocates assist by: providing information regarding victim's rights; assisting victims in locating shelter and other safe housing options; assisting in establishing immediate and long term safety plans; accompanying victims to court and meetings with legal counsel or command and law enforcement, and; providing information, professional referrals, and support. Soldier and Family Assistance Center

Soldier and Family Assistance Center (SFAC) provides assistance and support services to Soldiers who have been assigned to the Warrior Transition Unit (WTU) and their Families through the development, coordination, and provision of varied services designed to address

complex physical, personal, family, social, and economic needs. The SFAC services are tailored and responsive to the needs of our medically wounded. Most services will be present in the SFAC location in order to maximize the convenience to Soldiers and their Families. Other services will be brought forward on a part-time basis or SFAC will establish priority appointments on behalf of Soldiers at other offices. The SFAC manager at Fort Irwin can be reached at (760) 380-8380. The Army Wounded Soldiers and Family Hotline is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week at (800) 984-8523. This hotline offers wounded and injured Soldiers and Family members a way to seek help to resolve medical issues and to provide an information channel of Soldier medically related issues directly to senior Army leadership so they can improve how the Army serves the medical needs of our Soldiers and their Families. SFAC is located in Building 1034.

Survivor Outreach Services

Losing a loved one is one of the most difficult things anyone can go through. In its commitment to the Families of the Fallen, the United States Army has developed a comprehensive Survivor Outreach Services (SOS) Program. The mission of the Survivor Outreach Services is to provide long-term support to Families of our fallen Soldiers by offering assistance with any concerns or issues, providing information on services and programs, and connecting Families to outreach organizations both inside and outside the Department of Defense. Several SOS program coordinators assist Family members with the program's

services. The SOS support coordinator provides long-term supportive services to surviving Family members. The coordinator serves as an advocate to Families and helps maintain a connection to the Army for as long as the Family desires. The coordinator arranges individual and group support counseling, and provides information and referral services within military installations or with available agencies in communities closest to where surviving Family members live. The SOS financial counselor provides financial assistance, investment education, and estate planning to assist the surviving Family member in reaching their financial goals. The financial counselor can be reached at (760) 380-9194 and is located in Building 111. An SOS benefits coordinator provides expertise on local, state and federal benefits to Families. The coordinator works with the Casualty Assistance Officer (CAO) to provide guidance and assistance with benefits and applications and connects the Family to benefit providers. The SOS program manager can be reached at (760) 380-8357 and is located in Building 561.

Army Volunteer Corps Program

Army Community Service is the home to the Army Volunteer Corps, which is the center of volunteer recruitment, referral, recognition and advocacy efforts for Fort Irwin. Volunteers are needed in a wide variety of positions throughout the installation. Volunteers can learn or enhance skills, get to know the community, meet new people, build their resumes, earn promotion points, and more. The Volunteer Coordinator, located in ACS, Building 561, will sit down with you to find the perfect volunteer position. Stop by or call (760) 380-8422 for information on how to track hours to ensure work-credit experience and installation credit. Volunteers log thousands of hours annually which help build a stronger community. Join the volunteer corps and become a proud member of the community. Now serving over 600 active volunteers!

Deployment and Mobilization Readiness Program

This program is designed to support active and Reserve component Soldiers and their Families. Guidance and assistance to Family Readiness Groups, rear detachment personnel, and Families is provided. All activities promote self-development, self-reliance and resiliency during times of mobilization and deployment, and foster teamwork in Family Readiness Groups. Pre-deployment briefings, a major function of Deployment and Mobilization Readiness, are conducted prior to unit departure and handbooks are provided



to Soldiers and their Family members. Homecoming and reunion orientation and training are coordinated with subject matter experts. Coping with Separation training is highly recommended and available for Spouses experiencing extended periods of separation. For more information call (760) 380-2399. The program manager is located in Building 109.

Child, Youth & School Services

CYSS is a network of systems and programs through which Fort Irwin provides quality child and youth development options that reduce the conflict between parental responsibilities and unit mission requirements. The objectives of CYSS are to support readiness and contribute to the quality of life of Families by providing developmentally appropriate care options for children and youth. CYSS provides: full-day, part-day and hourly child care programs; before- and after-school care programs; middle and teen programs; Family child care; team sports and outreach sports programs, and; resource and referral for on and off post. CYSS programs are designed to foster and develop children's physical, intellectual and socio-emotional capabilities regardless of the setting or length of time in care.

Parent Central Services for CYSS is located in Building 109 of the Reception Campus. Telephone: (760) 380-2257/2270.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTERS AND FAMILY CHILD CARE HOMES

CYSS accepts children ages 4 weeks to 18 years of active-duty military personnel, or installation civilian government employees. Single or dual military may place children 4 weeks old in the Child Development Center, or at birth in a Family Child Care home. All other children must be 6 weeks old.

Service is provided according to the following priorities:

- **Priority #1:** Children of a sole active-duty military parent
- **Priority #2:** Children of dual active-duty military parents
- **Priority #3:** All others, e.g., military households with a working spouse, DoD civilian households, DoD contract employee households, Reservists on active duty.

Child Development Center, Building 1317, is located at the corner of Innerloop Road and Normandy Drive. Programs offered:

- Full-Day Care, Monday through Friday, 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- Kindergarten Before/After program, Monday through Friday, 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Cactus Corner Child Development Center, Building 4150, is located on the corner of Barstow Road and North Loop Road. Programs offered:

- Full-Day care, Monday through Friday, 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- Part-day Strong Beginnings, Pre-kindergarten program, Monday through Friday, 8 to 11 a.m.

Schools

Silver Valley Unified School District provides educational services to Fort Irwin. The District Administration Office is located in Yermo, Calif. Telephone: (760) 254-2916.

Families residing off post in communities generally to the east of Barstow will be within the district.

Those who live in Barstow, or in communities to the west of the city, will be within the Barstow Unified School District. Telephone: (760) 255-6000.

On-post education facilities include the General Colin Powell State Preschool, serving 3 to 5 year olds; Jerry Lewis Elementary School, which covers kindergarten through second grade; Tiefort View Intermediate School, serving third, fourth and fifth grades, and; Fort Irwin Middle School, consisting of sixth through eighth grades. Total on-post population is approximately 1,900 students.

There are various school programs offered on post to provide assistance and enrichment to parents and children. These programs include a computer lab, band program for fourth through eighth grades, music programs for third, fourth and fifth graders, a school psychologist, speech therapist, school counselor, a health clerk,

English as a second language support and Special Education Programs for both elementary and middle school children.

Families who cannot afford to send their children to preschool may be able to do so for free through a state-funded preschool program operated by the San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools. The preschool, for 3 to 5 year olds, is a comprehensive child development program and holds class Monday through Friday, three hours a day. The goal of the program is to promote the intellectual, social and physical growth and development of pre-kindergarten-age children. Families must meet income guidelines, with the lowest income Families getting priority.

Fort Irwin Middle School is a traditional middle school serving approximately 350 students in grades sixth through eighth.

Extracurricular activities are provided for students at all levels. In an effort to promote student success, remediation and tutoring are provided by staff for students.

High school students attend Silver Valley High School in Yermo, Calif., approximately 37 miles south of Fort Irwin. The district provides bus transportation. A full range of academic, social and athletic opportunities are provided.

The Calico Continuation High School is located in Daggett, Calif., and provides a wide

range of opportunities for those students with special academic needs. The district provides bus transportation. Telephone: (760) 254-2715.

Continuing Your Education While at NTC

During your military service, take advantage of the educational and benefit programs provided by the Army. Tuition Assistance and GI Bill are programs available to Soldiers who qualify. MyCAA is available to many spouses. Financial aid, scholarships and grants are also available for Soldiers, spouses, dependents and civilians. The Education Center offers information on a variety of colleges and universities.

Fort Irwin Army Education Center

Soldiers and Family members have a golden opportunity to achieve their educational goals during their assignment at the NTC Fort Irwin. The Education Center has a staff of professional counselors to assist personnel in establishing degree plans and to provide counseling on tuition assistance, financial aid, scholarships and GI Bill.

3. Get the DU memo signed by your commander.
4. Return the DU memo to the Education Center.
5. Attend class or work on an online course in the Education Center computer lab or at a location designated by your command (not your home or room) between 3 and 6 p.m., two days a week (Monday through Thursday).

Connecting Family, Schools and Communities

Whether your child is going on to the next grade level, making a mid-year move to a new district, taking the leap from elementary to middle school, or advancing to high school, the first few weeks of school may be filled with anxiety as well as excitement. Army School Liaison Services can assist in alleviating some of these anxieties.

What is Army School Liaison Services? It is an Army-wide program designed to be an information link for parents, schools, school districts, communities and commands. They are here to help you and your student with school-related questions or concerns.

CYSS administers the program; the School Liaison Officer coordinates it. The SLO is located in Building 1300 on Meuse-Argonne Street, near the YS Gym and Self-Help Center. Telephone: (760) 380-6880.

The office offers a wide range of resources and information on topics such as:

- Scholarship information for both graduating seniors and continuing education adults.
- Public, private, charter and home schools, registration, scholarship opportunities, course selection guides, SPED Services, volunteering at the schools and more.
- Copies of school calendars, School Board meeting dates, bus schedules, athletic schedules and supply lists.
- Copies of the U.S. Army Secondary Education Transition Study (SETS) conducted by the Military Child Education. SETS details recommended coursework for secondary school students and gives helpful ideas to assist in ensuring a smooth transfer if a student should have to move to a new school in another school district, state or even overseas.
- A recommended list of important documents generally required for school enrollment that you should hand-carry to your next duty station.
- A list of website links and contact numbers of the receiving installation so you can research school information in that area before your move.
- Contact information when you're not sure where to go for assistance.

MEDDAC

The United States Army Medical Department Activity stands ready 24 hours a day to support the National Training Center mission and military families who live here. Comprehensive health and preventive medicine services are provided to active-duty personnel, both assigned and rotational, their Family members, and retirees.

The nature of care provided at Weed Army Community Hospital focuses on primary care, as well as occasional severe trauma. WACH has a total of 53 care providers to include specialists in General Surgery, Orthopedics, Pediatrics, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Internal Medicine, Family Practice, Mental Health, and one flight surgeon. A Physical Therapist, a Dietitian, and Optometrist complement the staff of health care providers.

The Clinical Laboratory, Radiology Department, and Pharmacy Service furnish necessary support activities, all of which result in comprehensive primary care.

Patients requiring a higher level of treatment are referred to other military as well as civilian treatment facilities, if necessary.

Military sick call is conducted Monday through Friday, 7 to 8:30 a.m., for units without an assigned Battalion Aid Station. Central appointments is open at 7 a.m. for active-duty service

members to schedule a sick call or same-day appointment.

WACH uses a primary care manager system. Soldiers and their Family members at Fort Irwin are assigned a primary health care provider.

All appointments for services provided at Weed Army Community Hospital are scheduled through a centralized Patient Appointment System with the exception of Radiology, Physical Therapy and Department of Behavioral Health. Appointments may be made by calling Central Appointments at (866) 460-5305 or may be booked online by going to www.tricareonline.com.

Patients with a problem that is not an emergency, but cannot wait for a routine appointment are referred to the Triage Nurse unit. The Triage Nurse contacts the patient and schedules a same-day appointment or provides advice for self care.

The Preventative Medicine Service provides Community and Occupational Health Nurse and Environmental and Industrial Health Services to Fort Irwin. PMS coordinates the smoking cessation program, the self-help program, and the food handlers course.

The Department of Behavioral Health Service provides direct Psychology and Social Work services to the community. The Family Advocacy Case Management Team is managed from this office.

Mary E. Walker Center

The Mary E. Walker Center provides a broad range of comprehensive services to our beneficiaries. These services include:

- **Family Practice:** Same-day and routine appointments from infants to all ages; active duty, retirement, and commission nominee physical exams; school and day care physical exams; focused disease-specific educational sessions; minor surgery, and; Exceptional Family Member Program.

Operations Group

Activated on Oct. 3, 1982, at Fort Irwin, the Operations Group mission is an integral part of the overall mission at the National Training Center.

Its mission is to train Army combat units to a demanding standard using realistic scenarios to provide training feedback to Soldiers, leaders, and staff at every level, platoon to brigade, as well as a flow of information to units, agencies and training institutions to improve the force.

Operations Group provides more than 600 After Action Reviews every rotation. These contain valuable information that provides battle planning, preparation and execution feedback to the training units. The group is approximately 700 Soldiers strong and is broken down into several field Combat Trainer teams qualified in the doctrinal conduct of battalions and brigades in combat, combat support and combat service support operations.

Operations Group has modified rotational scenarios to keep pace with the changing world environment. Training units are now challenged with a significantly more complex battlefield that includes civilians, media, United Nations officials, host country representatives, guerrilla forces, provincial reconstruction teams, weapons of mass effects and war crimes. The goal of these complexities is to replicate for



training units the actual conditions they would experience if deployed.

Operations Group has also modified scenarios to challenge the new digital systems employed by the Army's modernized forces. These modifications include an increased presence of the opposing forces on the battlefield, larger space for battles and a simulation of the activities of notional adjacent friendly and enemy units. This simulation helps train leaders and staffs by ensuring that units with increased battlefield awareness capabilities "see" a large, complex battlefield on their computerized systems.

Operations Group has been awarded seven Army Superior Unit Awards for distinguishing

itself by providing a rigorous and challenging combat training environment for rotational forces whether heavy, light, aviation or Reserve component units.

Operations Group continues to provide extremely challenging and rigorous training for leaders and Soldiers to prepare them to win on the 21st Century battlefield.


11th Armored Cavalry Regiment

The 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment's unique mission is vital to the readiness of our Army. The 11th ACR is the Army's premier maneuver unit, and serves as the Contemporary Operating

Environment Force at the NTC. The 11ACR provides Rotational training units the most capable and lethal combined arms opposing force in the world. The Blackhorse trains the Army, one unit at a time in the brutally harsh climate of the Mojave Desert. Consequently, the tough and uncompromising standards of the 11th ACR have become the yardstick against which the rest of the Army measures itself.

To accomplish their crucial Army training mission, the Regiment is organized with one armor squadron, one mechanized infantry squadron and a regimental support squadron. Ten times a year, the Regiment's troopers provide Rotational units with the most accurate replication of conditions in theater possible, to prepare them for upcoming deployments. Blackhorse Troopers simulate everything from town storekeepers to insurgent leaders, to give training units a true test of their lethal and non-lethal skills. Between these rotations, the Regiment's troopers focus on individual and crew-level combat proficiency skills to keep current on Army Soldier and qualification tasks.

Congress activated the 11th U.S. Cavalry on Feb. 2, 1901, at Fort Myer, Va. Since then the Regiment has gallantly served our nation in such places as: the Philippine jungles in 1901; Cuba as part of Teddy Roosevelt's army of pacification in 1905; Mexico with General John J. Pershing in 1916; California as a border regiment; World War II, as part of the XIII Corps, during its sweep from the Roer to the Rhine;



Vietnam and Cambodia, from 1966 to 1971; Germany, from 1972 to 1989; the Persian Gulf; and most recently, Iraq.

It was in Mexico on May 5, 1916, that the 11th U.S. Cavalry, commanded by Maj. Robert L. Howze, led the last mounted cavalry charge in U.S. history against a band of Pancho Villa's rebels. In the 1930s the Blackhorse again led the way by

experimenting with the first mechanized cavalry vehicles—few cavalrymen welcomed this change.

On Sept. 7, 1966, the 11th ACR arrived in Vietnam. There the Regiment received its own distinctive patch, earned 14 battle streamers, and had three of its troopers awarded the Medal of Honor. In February 1971, the regiment was redeployed to the United States and deactivated; however, on May 7, 1972, the Regiment was again called upon to patrol the East-West German border along the Fulda Gap. On Nov. 9, 1989, without a shot fired, the regiment's 17-year vigil along the Iron Curtain ended.

June 2004 saw the deployment of the 58th Combat Engineer Company (Red Devils), who serve under the 11th ACR. Their deployment took them to Baghdad with the 2nd Brigade, 10th Mountain Division in Baghdad to support Operation Iraqi Freedom.

On July 4, 2004, the Regiment itself received deployment orders for OIF. One month earlier the 2nd Squadron deployed in December 2004 to Babil Province, Iraq, to conduct support and stability operations with the 155th Mississippi National Guard. The 1st Squadron deployed in January 2005 to Baghdad. Over the course of the year they were attached to four different Brigade Combat Teams, conducting full-spectrum operations in the Baghdad area of operations. The Regimental Headquarters deployed to Mosul, Iraq, that same month and assumed duty as the division headquarters for Multi National Force North-West. The 11th ACR lost 20 Soldiers while serving in OIF.

916th Support Brigade

The 916th Support Brigade supports rotational Brigade Combat Teams with theater-level Reception, Staging, Onward Movement, Integration (RSOI) and Regeneration operations. It supports command and control of rotational Echelon Above Brigade sustainment units. In support of training, the 916th provides tactical aviation recon, attack, assault and lift. The 916th plans and executes rotary wing aviation operations for NTC headquarters and NTC units. The unit also provides trained and ready forces for worldwide contingency operations.

The commitment and professionalism of the Soldiers of the 1916th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion, the General Support Aviation Battalion, Department of Defense civilians and civilian contractors, is clearly demonstrated with each rotation at the NTC. The entire Brigade continues to transform to meet changing doctrine and evolving FORSCOM guidance while continuing to provide responsive and proactive installation-level logistical support to the major subordinate commands and tenant activities of Fort Irwin.

12th Combat Training Squadron (USAF)

The 12th Combat Training Squadron provides operational control and logistical support for units deployed to Air Combat Command's GREEN FLAG-West exercises at the NTC. This USAF unit trains Air Force, Army, Navy, Marine and multi-national forces through 3,000 fighter,

tanker and ISR aircraft sorties annually in combined air operations. The 12th CTS oversees planning, employment, instruction and feedback for deployed Tactical Air Control Party (TACP) and Weather units. The Squadron Commander is also the USAF liaison to the NTC commanding general and staff. The unit is comprised of eight officers and 23 enlisted personnel.

Reserve Component

The Reserve Component Operations, Plans and Training (RC-OPT) office serves as the training liaison for all Reserve Component (RC) units from company to brigade level. RC-OPT provides operations, training, logistics and funding guidance to RC units training at the NTC and facilitates staff integration, coordination and information sharing between AC units

The NTC and Its Environment

Fort Irwin is located about 37 miles northeast of Barstow, Calif., in the Mojave High Desert. The installation consists of more than 1,200 square miles of desert lands, hills and mountains. A wide variety of wildlife and vegetation communities are supported by distinct landscape features such as washes, gullies, rock outcroppings, cliffs and talus slopes, dunes, caves, springs and seeps. The installation is also home to two federally listed endangered species, the Desert Tortoise and Lane Mountain Milkvetch.

The Directorate of Public Works Environmental Division is charged with ensuring the immediate protection and long-term sustainability of this alluring landscape. Sustainability, in simple terms, is about meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their needs.

This objective requires creating an enduring, mutually respectful balance between the needs of ecosystems and the economic, or “mission,”

needs of the people within them. Fort Irwin uses an environmental management system to assist in meeting our environmental goals of sustainability and protection of the environment.

Our EMS works to comply with ISO 14001:2004. The Environmental Division, Directorate of Public Works, Building 602, is the central point to contact for environmental-related questions. A few of the key environmental programs you should be aware of are described below.

NATURAL RESOURCES

Fort Irwin's Natural Resources Program manages more than 755,000 acres of the Mojave Desert. Through implementation of the Mojave Desert Ecosystem Program and collaborative participation in the multi-agency California Desert Managers Group the Natural Resources Program is able to protect and enhance natural resources on the installation using adaptive watershed, landscape and ecosystem approaches. The program, implemented through an Integrated Natural Resources Management Plan, has

shown exceptional leadership and innovation in protecting wildlife and conserving resources in the Mojave Desert.

CULTURAL RESOURCES

Fort Irwin is proud of the rich cultural heritage found within its boundaries. Excavations and surveys have uncovered many periods of Mojave Desert history. Fort Irwin's Cultural Resources Program is engaged in systematic on-going archaeological surveys and inventories of cultural resources within installation boundaries. This program, which identifies, evaluates, protects and manages eligible historic properties, is leading the way in cultural resource management and has made significant contributions to our understanding of life in the Mojave Desert. As a reminder, it is against federal law and Army regulations to collect archaeological or paleontological material on federal lands. If you find something, please leave it in place and inform the proper authorities. They might even name the discovery after you!



ENVIRONMENT

WATER RESOURCES

All of Fort Irwin's water is ground water pumped out of three water basins: Irwin, Langford and Bicycle Lake. Our water source is limited. We ask that all residents and others on Fort Irwin please conserve water and take measures to not contaminate the water or the soil on post. Water quality data is available online. AIR QUALITY

In October 1994, the National Training Center established and began operating a PM10 (Particulate Matter 10 microns in size) monitoring network. The network consisted of seven operational monitoring stations strategically placed on the boundary of the NTC. PM10 is a mixture of materials that can include smoke, soot, dust, salt, acids and metals. Particulate matter also forms when gases emitted from motor vehicles and industries undergo chemical reactions in the atmosphere.

The purpose of the PM10 monitoring network is to monitor fugitive emissions of PM10 that result from Army activity such as training maneuvers

conducted on unpaved dirt roads. These measurements aid the Installation in determining if federal and state air quality standards are being met and what type of mitigation measures may need to be employed.

SOLID WASTE

Fort Irwin has its own landfill, compost facility and recycling center. Managing this volume of solid waste is a labor intensive and costly proposition. Although it's necessary for some items, land filling is by the far the least cost-effective method of disposition. When all of the various costs of operating a landfill are included the cost to dispose of one ton of trash equates to \$178. Of the remaining options, recycling presents the most beneficial choice. Recycling that same ton of trash only costs \$78. That is a \$100 per ton savings. In addition, money is returned to the installation from the sale of the recyclable commodities. This revenue is deposited into the Qualified Recycling Program (QRP) account.

Across the installation, containers are provided for the separation of trash from mixed recyclables. Please support our recycle program by depositing your waste in the appropriate containers. More information on what materials are

recyclable can be obtained by calling the installation recycling center at (760) 380-4226.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS AND WASTE

Fort Irwin's hazardous materials and hazardous waste is managed through a program called the Hazardous Substance Reduction Programs. This program provides life cycle management of all hazardous substances except medical and radioactive. The program has a goal of reducing the generation of hazardous waste and maximizing the recycling or reuse of suspected waste items.


A majority of items taken to the Pollution Prevention yard, or P2 yard, for disposal gets recycled or reused. This program also provides funds to the QRP account. Additionally, this program also serves the community by providing household hazardous waste and electronic waste disposal services.



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The Fort Irwin area is rich with history dating back almost 15,000 years, when Native American Indians of the Lake Mojave Period were believed to live in the area. Indian settlements and pioneer explorations in the area were first recorded when Father Francisco Barces, a Spaniard, traveled the Mojave Indian Trail in 1796. During his travels, he noted several small bands of Indians and is believed to have been the first European to make contact with the Indians of this area.

Jedediah Smith is thought to have been the first American to explore the area in 1826. A fur trapper, Smith was soon followed by other pioneers traveling the Old Spanish Trail between Santa Fe and Los Angeles. Bitter Springs, on the eastern edge of Fort Irwin, was a favorite stop-over site.

In 1844, Capt. John C. Fremont, accompanied by Kit Carson, was the first member of the U.S. Army to visit the Fort Irwin area. Fremont established a camp near Bitter Springs that served travelers on the Old Spanish Trail, and later the Mormon Trail, linking Salt Lake City to California. This camp was later to become an important supply center for pioneers during California's settlement and gold rush.

The California Gold Rush brought prosperous trade and unexpected trouble to the area. As

California grew, and more travelers used the trails to enter the territory, raids and horse stealing became a problem. In 1846, the Army's "Mormon Battalion" patrolled the Fort Irwin area to control the raiding and horse stealing. During the Indian Wars the Army constructed a small stone fort overlooking Bitter Springs and patrolled the Fort Irwin area.

In the 1880s the area experienced an economic boom with the discovery of borax at Death Valley. From the late 1800s to the early 1900s, the area began to grow tremendously as mining operations of all types flourished. Soon railroads, workers, and businesses led to the establishment of the nearby town of Barstow.

The years following the Indian Wars were quiet militarily. In 1940, President Franklin Roosevelt established the Mojave Anti-Aircraft Range, a military reservation of approximately 1,000 square miles in the area of the present Fort Irwin. In 1942, the Mojave Anti-Aircraft Range was renamed Camp Irwin, in honor of Maj. Gen. George LeRoy Irwin, commander of the 57th Field Artillery Brigade during World War I. Two years later, Camp Irwin was deactivated and placed on surplus status.

Camp Irwin reopened its gates in 1951 as the Armored Combat Training Area and served as a training center for combat units during the

Korean War. Regimental tank companies of the 43d Infantry Division from Camp Pickett, Virginia, were the first to train at the new facility.

The post was designated a permanent installation on Aug. 1, 1961, and renamed Fort Irwin. During the Vietnam War buildup, many units, primarily artillery and engineer, trained and deployed from Fort Irwin.

In January 1971, the post was deactivated again and placed in maintenance status under the control of Fort MacArthur (Los Angeles), Calif. The California National Guard assumed

full responsibility for the post in 1972. From 1972 to late 1980, Fort Irwin was used primarily as a training area by the National Guard and Reserve components.

On Aug. 9, 1979, the Department of the Army announced that Fort Irwin had been selected as the site for the National Training Center. With more than 1,000 square miles for maneuver and ranges, an uncluttered electromagnetic spectrum, airspace restricted to military use, and its isolation from densely populated areas, Fort Irwin was an ideal site for a National Training Center. The National Training Center was officially activated Oct. 16, 1980, and Fort Irwin returned to active status on July 1, 1981.

Since its activation, the National Training Center has witnessed many firsts. The first unit to train against the Opposing Force at the NTC were from 1st Brigade, 1st Infantry Division in January 1982. Infantry and engineer units first augmented the Opposing Force in 1984. June 1984 saw the first use of M1 Abrams tanks and M2 Bradley Fighting Vehicles on the National Training Center battle field. The first armored cavalry squadron rotation occurred in November 1984. Units from the 101st Airborne Division participated in the first light force rotation in March 1985. The 197th Infantry Brigade participated in the first extended rotation with brigade operations in June 1985. The first urban terrain mission was conducted at the National Training Center Pioneer Training Facility in December 1993.

The National Training Center and Fort Irwin continue to serve as the Army's premier training center. Officials from many countries have visited the National Training Center and use it as a model to build their own training centers. As in the past, Fort Irwin pits Soldiers against a harsh environment, but now adds a determined and formidable opposing force. As during World War II, Korea, Vietnam and Iraq, the National Training Center and Fort Irwin continue to train units to fight decisively and win on any battle field.

Building up Fort Irwin

While the rest of the Army is tightening its belt, Fort Irwin is continuing, with limited construction, to make itself better. The following is an update on a variety of construction jobs currently being conducted on post.

Tactical Equipment Shop
GSE Construction Co., of Livermore, Calif., is currently building a maintenance shop at the end of Barstow Road. "The shop, which will be used by the 87th Engineer Company, will have one large building which will have four maintenance bays, a welding shop, POL facilities and offices," said Richard Tanner, project manager. "There will also be an oil storage facility and a five acre parking area," Tanner said. Even though GSE is from northern California, "we hired a lot of local contractors. We found a lot of real good people; which, help the local economy," Tanner added. According to Tanner, over \$2 million was subcontracted out locally. The \$3.5 million job, which began June 8, 1992, is scheduled to be completed by June 3 of next year, but Tanner said he is confident they will be able to finish before then.

Dining Facility
A new dining facility, located on the corner of 7th St. and Ave. B, is tentatively scheduled to begin operations on Sept. 18, according to Maj. A.B. Garcia, chief of engineering at DPW. "The dining facility is complete except for some minor furnishings," according to Col. Hal Fuller, garrison commander. "It will be manned by Army people and we're waiting for them to get here." This project, which took a year to build and was managed by the Corps of Engineers, will serve the 177th Armored Brigade and will augment the Regimental Dining Facility.

Soldier's Club
"The contract for a new soldier's club is still being advertised and a winner will be awarded by the end of October of this year," Garcia said. "The ground breaking for the new soldier's club will be in November," Fuller added.

Fort Irwin and the National Training Center is conveniently located in a central area of Southern California within the Mojave Desert. The communities near our military installation constitute an area of Southern California affectionately known as the High Desert. The High Desert includes Baker, Barstow, Victorville, Silver Lakes and Apple Valley; some of these communities are located on what used to be U.S. Route 66. The Inland Empire is located south of the High Desert and is comprised of cities such as San Bernardino, Riverside, Redlands, Ontario, Rancho Cucamonga, and Fontana. The greater Los Angeles metropolitan area is located southwest of the High Desert and includes communities such as San Gabriel, East Los Angeles, Hollywood, Santa Monica, Burbank, Long Beach, and the San Fernando Valley. North of Fort Irwin and the NTC is located Las Vegas, Hoover Dam, Lake Mead and Salt Lake City, Utah.

The travel, recreational, cultural, and entertainment opportunities in proximity to Fort Irwin and the NTC are numerous and extraordinary. Southern California is one of the few places on earth where you can ski and enjoy the beach in the same day. The Los Angeles area boasts a

Mediterranean climate, with moderate temperatures year-round. Famous beaches and surf spots include Huntington Beach, Santa Monica and Malibu. Within the San Bernardino Mountains and Angeles National Forest (approximately two hours from post), there are ski resorts such as Bear Mountain and Mountain High.

Historical and cultural activities are substantial. Nearby Calico Ghost Town presents a look at the booming days of silver mining that took place in the area. Barstow has the Mojave River Valley museum and Route 66 “Mother Road” Museum inside the historic Harvey House. Los Angeles is home to many museums such as the Getty, the Museum of Contemporary Art, the Los Angeles County Museum of Art and the California Science Center (home of the retired Space Shuttle Endeavour). The Disney Concert Hall in Los Angeles is the home of the Los Angeles Philharmonic and has been the venue for performances of “The Phantom of the Opera” and “Wicked.”

Recreational attractions range from off-road areas to National Parks. The High Desert is home to a thriving community of off-road enthusiasts. Many areas around I-15 in the High Desert are available for off-road recreation. National Parks nearby include: Joshua Tree, Death Valley, Sequoia, Yosemite, Kings Canyon, the Grand Canyon, and the Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area.

Water sports and recreation opportunities are also abundant. The Colorado River is approximately three hours away. The river serves as the state line with Arizona; boating, swimming and fishing is allowed in areas such as Lake Havasu, Needles, and Laughlin. The harbor areas of Los Angeles allow visitors to book trips for whale

watching, deep-sea fishing and excursions to Catalina Island. It is also a launching point for cruise vacations on the Pacific.

Southern California sporting venues, events and teams include: NASCAR racing in Fontana; the Los Angeles Dodgers and Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim; the annual Rose Bowl game; the Los Angeles Lakers; the Anaheim Ducks hockey team; the L.A. Galaxy soccer team; numerous marathons and fund-raising 5k/10k runs; professional boxing in Las Vegas, and; horse racing at Santa Anita.

Entertainment venues run the gamut from Las Vegas to Disneyland. In Las Vegas you’ll have a chance to see performances of all genres—from concerts to celebrity impersonators to elaborate magic shows to comedians. Southern California is home to attractions such as the San Diego Zoo, SeaWorld, Knott’s Berry Farm, LEGOLAND, Raging Waters, Six Flags Magic Mountain, and many more.

If you were wondering what there is to do outside Fort Irwin, then you have nothing to worry about. Many of the attractions and venue tickets can be purchased at Leisure Travel Services. The LTS and Outdoor Recreation (both are FMWR sub-agencies) can also help you plan an outing or vacation.

Welcome to Marine Corps Logistics Base Barstow. You will soon become an integral part of the MCLB Barstow team, serving along with approximately 120 fellow active-duty Marines, sailors and 1,700 civilians.

Directions

MCLB Barstow is located halfway between Los Angeles and Las Vegas on Interstate 40. It is approximately 120 miles northeast of Los Angeles and 150 miles southwest of Las Vegas in the Mojave high desert. The City of Barstow has a population of more than 23,000.

If you are flying into Ontario International Airport to reach MCLB Barstow, you will need to take ground transportation from the airport to Barstow. From the airport, take Interstate 10 East toward San Bernardino. Merge onto Interstate 15 North toward Barstow/Las Vegas for about 80 miles. Once you reach Barstow, take Interstate 40 for two miles until you reach the installation.

If coming in from the east, Barstow is the second to the last stop on Interstate 40.

If arriving by bus, you will arrive in Barstow at the famous Barstow Station, located on Main Street; if arriving by train you will arrive at the Harvey House, located at 685 North 1st Avenue, in Barstow. If you need transportation, take a taxi to

MCLB Barstow (Nebo) and check in at Building 15 with the base duty officer (BDO). If you cannot take a taxi, call the BDO at (760) 577-6961.

If you do not have transportation, contact your assigned sponsor and make arrangements with him or her to coordinate your transportation requirements. Sponsorship assignment is mandatory at MCLB Barstow. For more information

It is important to hand carry the following information or documents, if applicable: medical/dental records, copy of official orders, school records (for you and your children), personnel file (SRB), training records, birth certificates, social security cards, pink slips/titles for vehicles,



resumes, insurance papers, passports, warranties, road hazard insurance papers, prescriptions, etc.

Reporting In

Arrival and check-in requirements need to be coordinated with your sponsor and the Military Personnel Division. Your check-in process will begin at the Administration Section located in Building 15. Your check-in sheet, along with your sponsor, will guide you through the process.

After 4:30 p.m. on weekdays, weekends and holidays, personnel should report to the base duty officer located in Base Headquarters, Building 15. The BDO's phone number is (760) 577-6961.

before securing off-base housing. Once cleared through the Command, they are advised to contact the Fort Irwin Housing Referral Office at (760) 380-3576 or DSN: 470-3576, or visit the Automated Housing Referral Network at www.ahrn.com, for a listing of suitable houses on the economy.

The Housing Office is open Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Firearms Registration

All firearms and dangerous weapons, to include BB guns, pellet guns, blow guns, air-operated weapons, K-bars and hunting knives with blade lengths over four inches, bows and arrows, dart guns and sling shots, must be registered with the Pass and ID section, (760) 577-6457/6969/6371, within 24 hours of the first work day after the weapon is brought aboard the base. All sergeants (E-5 pay grade) and below who live in the barracks must store their firearms in the Base Armory or off base. All staff sergeants (E-6 pay grade) and above may store their weapons in their BEQ/BOQ room.

While pending registration, firearms and dangerous weapons will not be maintained in the bachelor enlisted quarters, Temporary Lodging Facility or inside a privately owned vehicle. These firearms and weapons will be stored in the Base Armory. Firearms and dangerous weapons not properly registered or stored are subject to confiscation by the Marine Corps Police Department.

Vehicle Registration

Temporary and permanent vehicle decals are issued for military/civilian members and contractors working aboard MCLB Barstow. Personnel reporting for duty must register their vehicles with the Pass and ID section within 30 days of their reporting date.

The driver must present a current and valid state registration, driver's license and proof of liability insurance required under California law (\$15,000 for injury or death of one person per accident, \$30,000 for injury or death of two or more persons per accident and \$5,000 for property damage per accident), military ID card or civilian/contractor badge or check-in sheet.

All vehicles are subject to inspection/search upon entering the installation.

In addition to all vehicle registration requirements, motorcycle operators must pass a motorcycle safety course offered by the Base Safety Office prior to the issuance of a decal. Call (760) 577-6457/6969/6371 for more information.

Pet Registration

Dogs and cats living on base must be registered with the Pass and ID section. Pets are allowed on base with no quarantine period but must meet San Bernardino County requirements (shots and licensing procedures). Call (760) 577-6457/6969/6371 for more information.

Horses may be stabled at the Base Stables at the Yermo Annex. Contact the Base Stables at (760) 577-7302 for additional stable information.

Identification Cards

Contractor and military/family member ID cards (including Reserve, National Guard and disabled veterans with proper documentation) may get their ID cards at the Pass and ID section. The Pass and ID section is located in Building 236. Hours of operation are Monday through Thursday, 6:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. (closed, 11 a.m. to noon); Friday, 6:30 a.m. to noon (closed all afternoon). Pass and ID is closed on weekends and holidays. Call (760) 577-6457/6969/6371 for vehicle, pet, weapon registration and information for military, civilian and contractor ID cards.



HISTORY AND MISSION



MCLB, presently the second-largest employer in the Barstow area, was established as the Marine Corps Depot of Supplies at its present location on Dec. 28, 1942, when the Navy turned it over to the Marine Corps as a storage site for supplies and equipment needed for Fleet Marine Forces in the Pacific theater during World War II.

By the end of World War II, the base had outgrown its facilities. As a result, 2,000 acres of land, approximately seven miles east of the Nebo side of the base, were annexed from the Army in October 1946. In 1954, the commanding general, Marine Corps Depot of Supplies, moved his flag from San Francisco to Barstow. Since then the base has grown in stature, strength and size.

In March 1961, the importance of MCLB Barstow increased dramatically with the establishment of the Depot Maintenance Activity. In November 1978, the base was redesignated to its present title of Marine Corps Logistics Base to emphasize its broad logistics support mission. In the early 1980s, MCLB Albany and Headquarters Marine Corps worked aggressively to integrate logistics support for the FMF and eliminate duplications. As a result, all operational logistics functions moved to Albany and in January 1990, the commanding general, MCLB Albany, was redesignated commander Marine Corps Logistics Bases. In 2003, the Marine

Requirements Oversight Council reevaluated how the Corps' logistics operations can best support its operating forces. Council members determined refining the acquisition and how the total life cycle management of weapons systems and equipment would make an immediate improvement in the excellence in warfighting campaign. The result: Marine Corps Logistics

Bases merged with the Marine Corps Materiel Command to become the Marine Corps Logistics Command, (LOGCOM).

Headquartered in Albany, Ga., LOGCOM was comprised of five major components: MCLB Albany; MCLB Barstow; Blount Island Command Jacksonville, Fla.; Maintenance Center Albany; and Maintenance Center Barstow.



HISTORY AND MISSION



Generally speaking, MCLB Albany furnishes supplies for Marine Corps forces east of the Mississippi and to forces which are part of the Atlantic Fleet. MCLB Barstow supports Marine forces west of the Mississippi, the Far East and Asia, while Blount Island Command provides logistical support for the Marine Corps' Maritime Prepositioning Ships and the Norway Geo-Prepositioning programs.

On Oct. 1, 2005, MCLB Barstow was realigned from LOGCOM to the newly formed Marine Corps Installations West, Camp Pendleton, as a

result of the regionalization of Marine Corps bases and stations. Maintenance Center Barstow and Fleet Support Division remain under LOGCOM.

MCLB Barstow is composed of three principal sites: Nebo, which encompasses 1,879 acres and functions as base headquarters and is the main facility for administration, storage, recreational activities, shopping, and housing functions; the Yermo Annex encompasses 1,859 acres and is primarily a storage and industrial complex; and the third site, 2,438 acres, serves as the rifle and pistol ranges.

The base is located near Interstate 40, three-and-a-half miles east of the city of Barstow. MCLB Barstow is a vital link in the logistics complex that provides the weapons systems, equipment and special logistics essential to supporting the assigned missions of the Fleet Marine Forces. To accomplish this, Barstow is positioned in a strategic geographical location. It lies at the junction to three major highway systems of Interstate 15, Interstate 40 and Highway 58. It's the hub of all West Coast rail traffic for the Burlington Northern/Santa Fe and the Union Pacific railroads. It's in the immediate proximity to the Daggett Airport, and the city is within 150 miles of the two major seaports of Los Angeles and San Diego. Because of its arid desert climate, equipment can be stored outdoors with minimal maintenance required.

Defense Logistics Agency — Distribution Barstow

DLA Distribution Barstow California is a Defense Logistics Agency co-located depot under the command of the Defense Distribution Center (DDC).

DLA Distribution is made up of distribution facilities at two locations eight miles apart, Nebo and Yermo Annex. Headquarters, administration, central receiving, shipping, storage and support facilities are located at Nebo. Most of the outdoor storage is located at the Yermo Annex. The depot receives, stores, and ships supplies to military customers located in the United States and the Pacific Theater of Operations as well as around the world.

Located on one of two Marine Corps Logistics Bases in the United States, DLA-DB is one of 26 depots operated by the Defense Distribution Center headquartered in New Cumberland, Pa. Overall management is provided by the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) located at Fort Belvoir, Va., which oversees the management of 5.2 million items and 360,000 prime contracts valued at 900 billion for the Department of Defense.

The major commodities stored by DLA-DB are electronic parts and components, radioactive material, clothing and textiles, replacement

parts of military equipment, engines and transmissions, shafts, reduction gears, wire cable, furniture, boats and anchors, radar units and propellers.

On Aug. 13, 2000, as a result of an A-76 competition, the depot functions were taken over by a civilian contractor, EG&G Logistics from Austin, Texas. It is now operated by Akima Logistics

Services, headquartered in Anchorage, Alaska. Eleven government employees have remained on-site as part of the depot's Continuing Government Activity (CGA). Their responsibility is to oversee the contractor's operations and lend technical assistance when necessary. See "DLA Distribution Barstow" in the telephone directory for phone numbers.



DLA Disposition Services

DLA Disposition Services manages excess property generated by DoD activities in central California and Nevada. In addition to MCLB Barstow, DRMO manages locations at Twentynine Palms, Naval Weapons Center China Lake, Edwards Air Force Base and Nellis Air Force Base.

DLA Disposition services and programs include reutilization, transfer, donation (RTD) and sales, as well as environmental, recycling, demilitarization and precious metals recovery. Production Plant Barstow, Marine Depot Maintenance Command

Production Plant Barstow's (PPB) mission is to provide depot-level maintenance support to the armed forces of the United States so that they are able to conduct their training, operational, mobilization, and emergency requirements without impediment. PPB's vision is to be the maintenance provider of choice for the operating forces and other customers through teamwork, innovative business practices and a highly skilled and motivated workforce. PPB is an efficient organization, geographically located, and positioned to provide responsive maintenance support for the operational forces. Located at the Yermo Annex, it is housed in the largest single-story structure ever constructed for the Marine Corps. Virtually all Marine Corps ground equipment can be repaired or modified here. PPB has more than 300 product lines dedicated to repairing and overhauling all ground equipment used by the Marine Corps. Workload ranges from heavy metal such as tanks and light armored vehicles to the LW-155 777 155mm, the latest in lightweight artillery. PPB is one of only two depot maintenance facilities in the Marine Corps. PPB is under operational control of Marine Depot Maintenance Command, Albany, Ga.

Fleet Support Division

The Fleet Support Division's mission: receipt, inspect, account for, issue, store and manage the Care-In-Store Program for Stores Account Code 3 (SAC3) Principal End Items (PEI) and small arms components; Execute Supply Support Program; assemble and disassemble collateral

material (CM), Supply System Responsibility Items (SSRI), Sets, Kits, and Chests in support of Marine Corps requirements; provide technical assistance to Marine Corps Forces Reserve (MARFORRES) West; and develop and monitor quality control programs. FSD is located at the Yermo Annex. See Fleet Support Division in the telephone directory for phone numbers.

Special Staff Department

COMMAND INSPECTOR GENERAL

The Command Inspector General's Office provides a single point of contact for all inquiries, complaints, and investigations for the base commander. OFFICE OF THE STAFF JUDGE ADVOCATE

PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE

PAO provides public affairs support to base and tenant organizations. This office handles all media inquiries directed to the base, it keeps base employees, local media and community members informed of matters regarding MCLB Barstow and the Marine Corps through various mediums of communication. One such medium is the Prospector, the base's bi-weekly news magazine. Classified ads in the Prospector are free to active duty, retired military, their families and base DoD employees. Headquarters Battalion

S-1 Manpower Department

The Installation Division provides all personnel, equipment, tools, materials, supervision, and other items and services necessary to perform services as defined in the Performance Work Statement (PWS) for MCLB and all other customers.

The Public Works Division provides professional planning, project management, and engineer services for all work performed outside of the PWS, to include military construction and other special projects. It also administers the PWS and provides comprehensive quality assurance. Public Works also oversees the operation of family housing.

The Housing Branch performs the administration, budgeting, and management of family housing quarters, a self-help warehouse and the recreational vehicle storage area.

The Contracting and Purchasing Division provides contracting support to all activities and tenants in support of Marine Corps forces and other customers.

S-6 Communications Department

The Communications Division's mission is to provide secure, reliable, flexible and timely communications services for the base and tenant activities. Its vision is to instill professional excellence within its staff to empower individuals to innovate and achieve seamless communications for its customers.

S-7 Security and Emergency Services Department

The Public Safety Department is composed of the Marine Corps Police Department (MCPD) and the Fire and Emergency Services Division (FESD). It ensures the existence of a lawful and orderly environment necessary to maintain mission readiness. It enhances mission capability by protecting U.S. homeland and critical bases of operation through risk management, education and emergency response.

S-8 Comptroller Department

The Office of the Comptroller is located in Building 15 (Base Headquarters) and consists of two offices that specialize in financial management functions. The Budget Office performs budget formulation and execution policies and procedures to manage both the Command's direct and reimbursable financial resources. Further, it maintains Inter-Service Support Agreements for reimbursable customers. The Resource Evaluation and Analysis Office provides an objective in-house capability to analyze, evaluate, and review the adequacy of management and





financial records, procedures, and practices to promote effective and efficient use of resources. It serves as the base point of contact for all Internal Management Control Programs.

Marine Corps Community Services Department

Marine Corps Community Services (MCCS) Department consists of Business Operations and Support, Semper Fit, Marine Corps Family Team Building (MCFTB), and Marine and Family Services, all of which are designed to enhance the “quality of life” by providing quality programs, products, and services to the military community, their families, and other authorized patrons. Marine Corps Mounted Color Guard

The Marine Corps Mounted Color Guard was formed aboard Marine Corps Logistics Base (MCLB) Barstow in 1967 and designated an official Mounted Color Guard by Headquarters Marine Corps in 1968. This is the only remaining Mounted Color Guard in the Marine Corps today.

The Bureau of Land Management honored this unit by portraying it on the first edition of the BLM’s “Wild Horse” trading cards.

This elite military unit has performed throughout the Western United States, traveling as far as Memphis, Tenn. The Mounted Color Guard has received numerous national awards including Overall High Point Champion and

Class Champion from the California National Association of Paraders from 1980 to 1985, 1989 and 1991 to 1997, and Overall Outstanding Equestrian Group from 1987 to 1989. The Mounted Color Guard no longer competes due to military regulations.

In January 1985, the Mounted Color Guard made its first appearance in the Tournament of Roses Parade. Since January 1990, the Mounted

Color Guard has participated in the Tournament of Roses Parade. The unit has been given the extreme honor of being the first military unit to lead the parade in 1990, 1995, 1998, 2001 and 2002.

It has also participated in events such as the Fiesta Bowl, Super Bowl Parades and Military Finals Rodeos. This unit is active with public schools and participates with the DARE Program and Good Citizenship Programs.

Horses in the unit are wild mustangs of Palomino color adopted from the Bureau of Land Management’s Adopt a Horse and Burro Program. The mounts are gentle and trained by the Marines.

The Mounted Color Guard members are active-duty Marines who volunteer their time—evenings, weekends and holidays—and perform these duties in addition to their regular duties.

Human Resources Office

Because more than 80 percent of the base's personnel are civilian employees, the Human Resources Office plays a vital role in advising and assisting managers and supervisors to recruit, reward, motivate, properly pay, develop and retain quality workers and to promote equal employment opportunities for all.

The Federal Employment Program is based on public law, Presidential Order and regulations issued by the U.S. Office of Personnel Management. Retired Activities Office


Located in Building 129, the Retired Activities Office is the link between the retiree, local military communities and other government and non-government agencies that provide assistance to retirees.



LOCAL AREA



Introduction

Barstow, “Gateway to the great mysterious desert,” has more to offer than meets the eye. Do not underestimate what this town has to offer. Everywhere there are surprises. Volcanic cinder cones, booming sand dunes, historic and modern mines, rock formations etched with messages from former residents, vast vistas framed with mile-high mountains and small towns dotted along historic Route 66.

This is the Mojave Desert. Natural beauty, an abundance of outdoor activities, historical sights, modern shopping centers, fine dining and a variety of accommodations are all here.

Overall, Barstow is a peaceful and tranquil town where you and your family can avoid the distractions and pressures of demanding city traffic and crowds, while exploring a dusty jewel of the high desert.

History and Orientation

A railway town since its founding, the city of Barstow, as of July 2011, has a population of 22,975, with a trade area encompassing more than 60,000 people (incorporating the communities of Barstow, Daggett, Ft. Irwin, Hinkley, Lenwood, Newberry Springs and Yermo). In 1888, the Santa Fe Railroad arrived in town and a splendid station

was built in the middle of the Mojave Desert. Named after the president of the Santa Fe, William Barstow Strong, the town soon became a service center for the gold and silver mines that surrounded the community. Before all this feverish activity in the late 1800s, the Mojave Desert had been occupied by Native American tribes who

(2,000 years ago) lived beside the immense lakes that covered most of the Mojave. Today, the landscape is bone dry, and Barstow is a highway town, at the junction of Interstate Highways 15 and 40, on the routes between Los Angeles, Las Vegas and Flagstaff. The railway station has been converted into a restaurant and shops.



Transportation

Air, rail, truck, highway and bus systems make Barstow a complete California transportation center. Interstates 40 and 15 and State Highways 58 and 247 provide easy access by car to surrounding cities in Southern California including Los Angeles, San Diego, and other popular coastal cities as well as to the neighboring states: Arizona, Nevada and Utah.

While there are no major commercial airports in Barstow, Ontario International Airport (77 miles southwest), Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) (131 miles) and Las Vegas (157 miles) all schedule passenger and freight services. Barstow-Daggett Airport and Southern California International Airport Adelanto (30 miles southwest) also offer these services.

The rail facilities of both Santa Fe and Union Pacific provide the utmost in rail service to the shipper. Both Amtrak and Greyhound Bus offer passenger service to and from Los Angeles and Las Vegas.

For local transportation services, Laidlaw Transit Service/Dial-a-ride provides its fixed-route transit system services by bus to and in the Barstow area.

The Department of Motor Vehicles provides vehicle registration, driver's license, and ID card services to the Barstow community and is located at 528 E. Virginia Way.



Barstow has an area labor force of 12,500. Ft. Irwin and the Marine Corps Logistics Base (MCLB) are the largest with more than 10,200 workers, between the two alone—nearly half including civilians and private contractors. Construction, trades, utilities, transportation and grocery employees are generally unionized.

The Bureau of Land Management-Barstow is the public's resource for information, management and assistance on the use of public land in the Mojave Desert and other public land areas. Its mission is to sustain the health, diversity, and productivity of the public lands for the use and enjoyment of present and future generations.

The Barstow Field region covers an area from the northern boundary of Joshua Tree National Park to the southern boundary of Fort Irwin Military Reservation and from the eastern boundary of San Bernardino National Forest to north of Death Valley Junction, Calif., as far as the California/Nevada state line.

The Desert Dispatch serves Barstow and other surrounding communities as the main newspaper publication. Four radio stations, one regional TV station, one TV cable system, and one TV translator also provide Barstow with other specialized means of media communications. The Highway Stations (KHWY-FM 98.1 and 99.7) and Highway Country (FM 107, 101.5 and 101.1) cover more than 40,000 square miles of the Mojave Desert area. They bring travelers of the Interstate 15 and 40 highways continuous news, traffic and weather updates as well as provide hours of a variety of music favorites for travelers' listening pleasure. The Highway Stations also feature The Las Vegas Connection where Las Vegas-bound tourists can get information on current and upcoming events.

Housing Availability, Prices and Rentals

Rentals for one- and two-bedroom apartments and townhomes range from \$575 to \$750 per month. Rentals for two- and three-bedroom homes range from \$550 to \$1,350. There are 14 mobile home parks and space rentals range from \$175 to \$230 per month. Low-income housing is also available through the San Bernardino County Housing Authority.

Hospital/Emergency Services

Barstow Community Hospital (BCH) is a 30-bed acute care hospital, with over 250 employees. Owned by the City of Barstow and operated by Community Health Systems Inc., the hospital provides quality comprehensive health care services, both inpatient and outpatient, to the surrounding High Desert community. It also offers some of the latest technologies including a nuclear medicine department, CAT scan, mammography imaging, a fluoroscopy room and more.

Education

Public education is provided by the Barstow Unified School District which has eight elementary schools, one junior high school, one high school, one continuation high school, an independent study program, and an adult education school. It also has two private schools and a community college (Barstow College).

BARSTOW COLLEGE

Barstow College offers educational opportunities from transfer level courses leading to an advanced degree to community service classes (or workshops) designed for continuing education, vocational enhancement, avocation or personal development pursuits.

The Barstow College campus is located on Barstow Road overlooking the city, the Mojave River, and the Calico Mountains. The campus

is an attractive green oasis in the desert with a variety of palm, cypress, oak and olive trees that form an ideal setting for student learning. Some facilities available on the campus are a large gymnasium (James R. Parks), a childcare facility (Child Care America), a comfortable meeting hall (the Norman Smith Center) and a state-of-the-art fitness center.

At \$36 per unit, the cost of attending Barstow College is relatively inexpensive. Non-residents pay \$176 per unit, in addition to the \$36 per unit enrollment fee. They also offer a Neighborhood Policy (Nevada reciprocal arrangement): \$42 per unit + \$36 per unit enrollment fee.

Museums and Historical Points of Interest

CALIFORNIA WELCOME CENTER

Located in the Tanger Outlet Center, the California Welcome Center houses an interactive Desert Tortoise Display as part of its Mojave Desert wildlife and history museum. There

are also a gem and mineral display, a children's indoor playground, and a gift shop that offers books in several languages. The center provides free local, regional and statewide visitor information. The center is open 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. For information, call (760) 253-4782.

ROUTE 66 MUSEUM/ MOTHER ROAD MUSEUM

Main Street in Barstow is the only remaining section of Historic Route 66 to still be designated "Main Street." The Mother Road Museum in Barstow houses pieces of a bygone era within the renovated walls of the Harvey House on North First Avenue. The Route 66 museum features a 1926 Dodge Touring Sedan as part of its collection, the first telephone switchboard used on Barstow's Main Street, model trains and historic photographs and other trinkets of the era. Also on display are two vintage motorcycles, including a 1947 Harley-Davidson police trike, an old gas pump, model trains, historic photographs, and postcards from around the area. There are plans for a room dedicated to the movement of Hispanic settlers on Route 66. For information, call (760) 255-1890.

THE HARVEY HOUSE

Casa Del Desierto Harvey House was completed in 1911 and restored in 1996. This beautiful building is now on the national registry of historic

places. New to the Harvey House is the Western America Railroad Museum. Railroad memorabilia, old locomotives, photos and archives are available for public viewing. There are also two cabooses open for tours. The museum has many different types of exhibits including railroad china, watches and maps. For information, call (760) 256-WARM.

MOJAVE RIVER VALLEY MUSEUM

The museum is dedicated to the preservation and interpretation of the heritage of the past and present for the people of the Mojave River Valley. Housed here are collections of artifacts and information dealing with the history of the area from early man, through the accomplishments of space exploration (NASA's Goldstone Deep Space communications Complex - Ft. Irwin, Calif.). It houses gemstone and mineral displays that represent just a portion of the wealth still found in the Mojave Desert. Free admission. Please call (760) 256-5452 for information.

AUGUSTAN SOCIETY LIBRARY AND MUSEUM

The Augustan Society Inc. is a non-profit public benefit educational corporation located in the Villa Augusti. The library collections include heraldry, U.S. colonial genealogy, Native American cultures and art, Hispanic genealogical research and more. The main building features the imaginatively created private study of Howard Carter, the discoverer of King Tut's tomb; suits of armor, and a book and gift shop. Visits are by appointment only. For information and reservations, call (760) 254-9223.

Clubs and Organizations

There are more than 20 different clubs and organizations that meet each month and hold even more events, which you and your family can participate in, throughout the year. Some are for the elderly, retired military and families of military, hobbyists, artists, business people, etc., including the American Business Women's Association, Art Guild, Kiwanis, Toastmasters and NAACP, just to name a few. Barstow also offers more than 20 different places of worship and religious meetings.

Shopping and Dining

Barstow offers an extensive brand-name selection even for the most finicky of shoppers. Wal-Mart and Food4Less stores bring you bargain shopping as well as a great selection. Alternatively, you can stroll through a generous number of antique shops to complement your outlet shopping experience in downtown.



The **Barstow Station**, a shopping complex cleverly made up of railroad cars, has already been mentioned as being a favorite stopover for travelers and tourists. Yermo

The city of Yermo has a population of nearly 2,000 and two community parks—Wayside Park and Smith Park. The Union Pacific railway runs parallel to Yermo Road, the main drag of the town. Off of Marine Road, in Yermo, is the Marine Corps Logistics Base Barstow Yermo Annex.

CALICO GHOST TOWN

1881 marked the beginning of one of the largest silver strikes in California history and the birth of Calico. This authentic silver mining town, which lies in the colorful hills of the Calico Mountains just 10 minutes north of Barstow, lives on as one of the few original mining camps of the Old West. Today, you can visit this famous ghost town where silver dominated the town and the U.S. Borax Co. brought its 20-mule team to town on a regular basis.

Spend a day exploring the various mercantile stores that reflect the time of a bygone era. Some of these shops include blacksmiths, glassworks, general stores and more. Reflect on the time of a bygone era while participating in the guided underground Maggie Silver Mine Tour, gold panning, cowboy action shooting range, and much more. After a long day of activities, your family can dine at one of the mining day theme restaurants such as Lil’s Saloon or the Old Miner’s Cafe. Extend your stay at one of the 253 campsites (includes full hookups), six cabins, or a large bunkhouse, all tucked away in a secluded canyon. PEGGY SUE’S ‘50S DINER

“Eat to the beat” Peggy Sue’s is an original ‘50s roadside diner. Built in 1954, it was expanded and restored to its original charm in 1987. Shadowed by the Calico Mountains, it houses an extensive collection of movie and TV memorabilia. Dine here for breakfast, lunch or dinner. Enjoy great homemade chili and soups, a pizza parlor, soda fountain, ice cream parlor or old-fashioned candy—all to old-time ‘50s music. Peggy Sue’s also features a Five and Dime store, an arcade and Paradise Park with cool lagoons and sparkling waterfalls surrounded by shady trees.

Daggett

Daggett is a small town in the Mojave Desert, located approximately eight miles east of Barstow on Interstate 40. Those using Route 66 easily overlook it, and yet the “Mother Road” passes right through the town. Daggett is the “parent” community of the Mojave Valley. For nearly 40 years, Daggett was the hub of the Mojave Desert. As the outfitting point for mines in Death Valley, the Calicos, Vanderbilt and dozens of other locations, it was the recognized commercial center. Today the town is home to a modern airport, solar generating plants, agriculture, light industry and is at the junction of two major railroad lines.

DAGGETT MUSEUM

Daggett Museum opened in September 1991. The museum consists of more than 40 cases displaying early American collectibles, railroad



china, Navajo Indian code-talker artifacts from World War II, barbed wire, lapidary work, and much more, including a unique model of the Solar I generating plant. Daggett is an historical setting in its own right. Founded in the 1860s, 15 to 20 years before the filing of Waterman’s claim, the town was once called Calico Junction. It was renamed in the spring of 1883 to honor John Daggett, lieutenant governor of California from 1882 to ‘86. Special arrangements for different times and/or group visits can be made by calling (760) 254-2629, and leaving a message.

Outdoors

SAFETY AND PRECAUTIONS

Before setting foot on any outdoor adventures, visit the local ranger stations (contact the Bureau of Land Management) or other desert information resource establishments and get familiarized with the unique qualities and habits of the vast variety of plants and animals in the High Desert. This information can dispel common myths and misunderstandings, help avoid dangerous situations or encounters, yet allow one to appreciate what the desert has to offer. Also, before removing or altering archeological finds, be aware of the rules set forth by the Bureau of Land Management.

Archaeological Points of Interest

The geological treasures waiting to be discovered throughout the Mojave desert-preserved landscape include: precious minerals and stones, petrified wood, prehistoric artifacts and more. Today, a visit to Black Canyon and Opal Mountain offers an opportunity to view nearly 10,000 petroglyphs and pictographs.

MOJAVE NATIONAL PRESERVE

The 1.4 million acres between Interstate 5 and I-40 in southeastern California were designated by Congress as a national preserve in 1994 to protect the prehistoric, historic and natural resources found in the region. Elevations range from near sea level north of Baker, Calif., to over 6,000 feet in the Ord Mountains south of Barstow, and the terrain ranges from mountains to sand dunes. Indian rock art includes petroglyphs more than 10,000 years old and evidence of more recent human activity, particularly mining and cattle ranching, remains as well.

RAINBOW BASIN NATURAL HISTORIC LANDMARK

Fossils and minerals are contained in the rock walls, formed by millions of years of geological activity and displaying an array of colors. A driving tour is available for vehicles under 25 feet in length. Camping is permitted for a fee at Owl Canyon Campground.

EARLY MAN ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE

More than 12,000 stone tools dating back perhaps 200,000 years have been located in an excavation begun in 1964 by Dr. Louis Leakey. It is one of the oldest sites of prehistoric tools in the Western Hemisphere. Examples of excavated tools can be seen in the visitor center. Guided tours are available. Open Wednesday through Sunday. Closed holidays. Donations are accepted.

WILDLIFE

Though not always visible, wildlife is abundant across the Mojave Desert. There are over 300 different species of animals, including desert bighorn sheep, mule deer, coyotes, and desert tortoises. A variety of birds live in the desert as well. Golden eagles and several species of hawks can be seen soaring on the desert thermals. Gambel's quail, chukar and mourning doves, as well as many other small species of birds live in the canyons and washes where they are able to find water, food and vegetation for cover.

Snakes

There are several species lurking in the Mojave National Preserve and in the surrounding areas like the Desert Rosy Boa, a cousin to the South American constrictor, which grows to be only two or three feet in length. The easy-going Gopher Snake grows large, up to six feet in length, but rarely bites. Most dangerous are the Mojave Rattlesnake and the Desert Sidewinder, both of which are poisonous. Not to worry though, snakes and other formidable creatures typically remain in hiding far from human life during the day and only come out in the evening to hunt for rodents, insects and other small creatures.

Plants

Desert plants are especially adapted to living in this arid climate. Common plants include yucca, creosote, and the Joshua tree. The spring brings a colorful and abundant array of blossoms when the winter rains have watered the desert.


Camping

Off-Highway Vehicle Areas

Off-highway vehicle (OHV) riding is one of the major recreational activities in Southern California. Public lands available for OHV use are designated as either "Limited Use" areas or "Open" areas. Vehicles are required to remain on designated routes of travel within all of the "Limited Use" areas. "Open" areas are contained within a formal OHV boundary and permit cross-country travel. Some popular areas include: Stoddard Valley, Rasor, Dumont Dunes and more.





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


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

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


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
