Subj: INCREASED SECURITY MEASURES AT MARINE CORPS LOGISTICS BASE BARSTOW

Please be advised that USNORTHCOM has directed all military installations in the United States to implement heightened security measures at all entry gates, to include 100% ID checks, random inspections, and the suspension of the Trusted Traveler Program, until further notice.

Individuals are HIGHLY encouraged to pre-register guests they intend to sponsor onto the installation. This will significantly decrease delays at the facility.

All Individuals without a DoD-approved access credential will be required to obtain a visitor pass, and their sponsor must physically accompany them to the installation Visitor Center to complete the process.

Visitor Center Hours:

Monday - Thursday: 7 a.m. – 3 p.m. Friday: 7 a.m. – 12 p.m. Saturday & Sunday: Closed

During hours when the MCLB Barstow Visitor Center is closed, PMO can authorize individuals, with a sponsor present, temporary access until the next business day. Sponsors are responsible for bringing the individual to the Visitor Center by close of business the next business day to complete processing and credentialing of their guest.

Required Information for Access:

- -Full Name -Date of Birth -Passport or Driver's License Number
- -Phone Number
- -Sponsor EDIPI

Sponsor Responsibility:

Sponsors must have valid credentialing to enable base access and the ability to sponsor an individual and must escort their guest to the Visitor Center the next business day. If their guest no longer requires base access, sponsors must report to the Visitor Center to confirm their guest has departed the installation and no longer requires access. Failure to comply may result in debarment, restriction of future access, or loss of sponsorship privileges.

Drivers should expect delays, especially during high traffic hours, and increased random inspections at all entry gates until further notice.
